Businesses angry at the repeated flooding of their access road

THE road serving a Stratford industrial estate is a flooding nightmare, according to businesses based there.

This morning, as in Western Road soon again had to cope with widespread disruption to trade caused by flooding outside their premises this week.

Although Stratford had aucky escape from the recent flooding which wreaked havoc in other parts of

the country, a substantial downpour which fell on the area on Sunday night-Monday, inundated roads in all on some local roads and areas, notably in the eastern corner that Western Road which is home to many of Stratford business, including Stratford Car Bodies Ltd.

With flood water laying out inches deep, it was clear that the flooding, just as the business had so

"Customers don't want to walk through floodwater, they get annoyed, footsores in shoes, and do business with us and who can blame them? It's been like this for hours until the slydrain drains away and hope it doesn't get any worse."
