legal rights to shape the future of the town. They've come up with a set of proposals for policies they

on the right track by coming along to the Open Days at the Town Hall, looking at the details, filling in

a questionnaire and giving your feedback.

Proposals cover issues such as where new homes and offices should be built, what they should look

like, and how the Town Centre can be improved. Further suggestions on topics close to residents'

hearts concern regeneration, jobs, heritage, open spaces, leisure and infrastructure.
